The City of Pierre board of Commissioners met in regular session on September 28, 2021 with Commissioners Barringer, Huizenga, Vona Johnson and Mayor Harding present for roll call. Commissioner Todd Johnson was absent. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. The agenda was approved as amended. The Parking Closure Request – Ree Street from Club approach to Foss approach, October 1st was removed. No one was present for the public comment.

Commissioner Barringer moved and Commissioner Vona Johnson seconded to approve the consent calendar to include the Minutes from the Regular Meeting on September 21, 2021; New Hire – Tanya Lieberman – Park Superintendent \$61,536.77; Raffle Request – Capital Area United Way; Claims. Nick Water, Staff Engineer, presented the one bid received for River Road Storm Sewer Rehabilitation Project and recommended award. Subsurface Inc submitted a bid for \$492,409. The project is scheduled to be completed in early November. The project involves a fiberglass with epoxy that is cured in place with UV. The product is manufactured in Canton SD, so there is not anticipated issue with material delays. Commissioner Huizenga moved and Commissioner Vona Johnson seconded to award the bid for the River Road Storm Sewer Rehabilitation Project to Subsurface Inc for \$492,409 and authorize the Mayor to sign all related documents. Unanimous approval.

Ian Paul, Fire Chief, explained that he received a request to discharge fireworks behind Hyde Stadium following the Riggs High School Homecoming Football Game on October 1st. He has reviewed the plans, which include Tom Rounds and Smith Fireworks and are similar to previous fireworks from this location. Brian Moser, Riggs Athletic Director, explained that the event has been very popular and they are adding the burning of the letter immediately following the game and then they'll discharge fireworks. This scheduling change was done last year in response to Covid and worked well. Commissioner Vona Johnson moved and Commissioner Barringer seconded to approve the discharge of fireworks from behind Hyde Stadium on October 1st. Unanimous approval.

This being the time and place to consider the Alley Exchange Wine License Transfer from 339 S Pierre Street to 1615 N Harrison 2-A, Mayor Harding opened the hearing. April Stromer explained that they were provided an opportunity to move to the Pierre Mall and will be closing the downtown store on October 13th and opening the new store on October 16th. They will hold the ribbon cutting at 11am October 16th and hold a wine tasting event that day. Being no one else present to comment, Mayor Harding closed the hearing. Commissioner Vona Johnson moved and Commissioner Huizenga seconded to approve the Alley Exchange Wine License Transfer from 339 S Pierre Street to 1615 N Harrison Suite 2-A. Unanimous approval.

Mayor Harding explained that he would like to postpone the Commission consideration of the Dwelling Rental Registration and Inspection Program Ordinance until they have a full Commission present, which is scheduled for October 12th.

Commissioner Huizenga moved and Commissioner Vona Johnson seconded to adjourn. 5:52 p.m. Unanimous approval.
